## A virtual day of football fever


Stencilled Goalie Gloves

The greatest Reds Goalkeeper in history was Harry Hough. Born in Chapletown he played in 364 matches between 1947 and 1959. What a record!





Firstly draw around your hand and wrist then carefully draw a line about one centimetre around your hand shape and go over with felt tip pen.
Cut around this line carefully and remove the glove shape piece of paper.
An adult should supervise all cutting.



You now have a stencil which you should place on a second piece of paper. Take a third piece of paper and cut strips lengthways across the whole page. These will be used to create our design by laying them across our stencil and securing with tape like this.



We are now ready to add colour. Start by cutting a kitchen sponge into four or five squares. Pour a small amount of your chosen colours onto a plate. Keep sponge pieces separate for different colour. Dab first sponge in one of your blobs of paint and then dab onto your stencil. Repeat with as many different colours as you like and leave to dry.



When the paint looks dry carefully remove the strips and place them in the opposite direction to the first strips and secure with tape.



Dab a different colour all around the shape of the glove and leave to dry for a minute.



Remove the strips and stencil to reveal your original goalie glove
