


It is a tradition to send a postcard home from your summer holidays at the seaside or another country. This year it might be a bit different as lots of us aren't going on our normal holidays.

Make a postcard of a place you have enjoyed spending time at during lockdown or over the summer holidays. It might be the park, the reservoir, the river, the play area or town centre. You can imagine you are at the seaside if you like too.




Firstly draw two oblong shapes height 10cm x width 15cm. This is the traditional postcard size and shape



Make very simple drawings of your favourite or imaginary places and in a curve shape draw boxes for each letter of the name of the place you are making a postcard for.




Using only two colours you can create a very striking image.



Whatever version you decide to make don't forget to keep it simple. Use simple shapes, the postcards are quite small



You can make a banner to put your words into, such as 'wish you were here', 'greetings from', 'having a great time'



Finally cut both oblong shapes out and stick them together back to back and you can write a message to someone you love along with their address, put a stamp on and post it.
