Stone Age Foraging Challenge

The earliest people who lived in Britain were Paleolithic hunter gatherers. They arrived in Britain around 11,700 years ago, migrating from Europe over Doggerland, an area that is now where the North Sea is.

They would have looked like people living in Britain today. DNA studies on burials found from that time in the UK have shown that they would have had dark brown or black skin, very dark hair and blue, or green eyes.

Our Paleolithic ancestors were nomadic, travelling from place to place. They lived in huts or tepees and sometimes dwelt in caves.

They hunted animals such as bison, deer, mammoths and fish and foraged for fruits, berries, nuts and other edible plants.

Print and cut out these cards, or draw your own and hide them around your house and garden.


Challenge your friends or family to find them all and decide which plants they would eat and which are poisonous.
