

## Museums Make: Pine Cone Owl

What wildlife can you spot next time you visit Cannon Hall Park and Gardens?



When you go out for a walk, collect natural things you find as you go along. Remember to collect only fallen objects and be careful not to pick any poisonous plants or leaves - ask an adult if you are unsure.



Next glue your googly eyes to each of your circles. You could draw eyes onto the circles instead.



Spread out all the things you found on your walk and think about which pieces would work well. For our owl, we need two large eyes. Using some paper or thin card, draw around something circular. A glue stick is the perfect size and shape.



Next, glue your eyes, beak and feet onto the pinecone and leave to dry. Whilst they are drying, look at the other things you collected and find something that would make a good pair of owl wings. Add these last of all.



We also need a beak and some feet. Draw these shapes out onto your card or paper first and then cut them out.



Now you have a finished owl! Make your owl a friend- maybe have a go at making a mouse or a rabbit.
